#### **PARISH LIFE: SEPTEMBER-OCTOBER 2010**

The last month has been a quiet one in parish life, with the services for the Great Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross the only gatherings at church out of the ordinary. Encouragingly, these services on Sunday and Monday September 26-27 were very well attended, particularly the evening service at which the Holy Cross was brought out from the sanctuary in a solemn procession.

On Monday October 5 we had our usual October Long Weekend BBQ at Avoca Beach, with the rain once again clearing for us. 23 adults and 32 children gathered at Heazlett Park, a mixture of parishioners and friends from Sydney. Amongst the latter were Father Daniel Metlenko and his family from Centennial Park. Those present enjoyed ball games and hired canoes and paddle boats. It was a most enjoyable day, and warm thanks are due to Paul Pereboeff for having organised it.

Parish Council met on Tuesday October 12 to hear the usual reports on parish life and administration. The parish finances are in a very healthy state, with our "Future Fund" likely to have over \$20,000.00 in it by the end of this year. The Parish Council discussed parish accounting, the legal arrangements for ownership of parish property, and in something of a digression from regular business (after Father James presented some new icons – see below) the process by which saints are canonised in the Orthodox Church. #### PARISH LIFE: SOME NEW ICONS

Early in October, two new icons were placed in church. One, a small icon, is of Holy Righteous Fyodor (or Theodore) Ushakov, Admiral of the Russian Fleet. This icon was obtained in Russia by our parishioner Katya Rubbo. Saint Fyodor was an illustrious Russian naval commander of the 18<sup>th</sup> century who spent the final years of his life in a monastery. Long revered for his righteous life as well as for his military prowess, he was formally canonised by the Russian Orthodox Church in 2000. He commanded forty naval battles and won them all, crediting God with the victory. He won many notable victories against the Turks, liberating Orthodox Christians on the Greek Islands from the Moslem yoke. Upon his retirement, he bestowed much of his wealth upon the needy, particularly war veterans. He is commemorated on October 2/15, the day of his repose, and on 23 July/5 August, the day of his canonisation.

The other icon is a copy of the wonderworking Akhtyrskaya Icon of the Mother of God, the original of which is kept in our church at Croydon. This copy was framed and given to us by Protodeacon Vasily Hadarin of the Archangel Michael parish in Blacktown. Please remember Father Vasily and his family in your prayers.

#### PARISH LIFE: GENERAL MEETING IN NOVEMBER

On Sunday 7 November 2010 we will have an Extraordinary General Meeting of parish members in order to elect two delegates to attend the 16<sup>th</sup> Diocesan Assembly, to be held in Strathfield on Sunday December 26 and Monday December 27, 2010. Diocesan assemblies are triennial events at which clergy and lay delegates from parishes and monasteries across Australia and New Zealand hear reports on the life and administration of the Diocese. An important task is the election of a Diocesan Council of 5 clergymen and 5 laymen to assist the ruling bishop in the administration of the Diocese. Our parish is entitled to send two lay delegates, with Father James and Father Martin attending as clergy delegates. Parish members will receive formal notice of the meeting shortly, together with nomination forms. The meeting will also be announced in church on 17 October, 31 October, and 7 November. Any parish members interested in attending the Diocesan assembly are encouraged to discuss the matter with Father James.

### DIOCESAN COLLECTIONS IN OCTOBER, NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER

We have three collections coming up. The first is a special collection to help cover the expenses of the forthcoming Youth Conference, to be held this year in Avoca Beach. Although this collection is to be taken up on nearest Sunday following the feast of the Protection of the Mother of God, it will be taken up in our church on Sunday 31 October. During November and December each year parishes of our Diocese are obliged to take up two charitable collections. The first of these is for the Fund for Assistance to the Russian Orthodox Church outside Russia, formerly known as the Charitable Fund of the Synod of Bishops. The mission of the fund is to assist the Synod of Bishops by means of the moral-spiritual education of youth, support of needy clergy, and the provision emergency relief. The money that we have collected this year for Chile and Haiti have been passed to this Fund. This year, the general collection in our parish will be taken up on Sunday November 21.

The second collection is for Orthodox Action – Sydney, a charitable organisation that assists destitute children in Russia and other countries of the former Soviet Union. Particular assistance is given to children's homes, orphanages, and large needy families. A collection for OA-S is always taken up on the Great Feast of the Entry of the Mother of God into the temple, or on the nearest practical Sunday. This year, we will take up a collection for OA-S on Sunday December 5, the day after the Feast. To assist parishioners and friends to plan their contributions, envelopes for the November and December collections will be included with the November newsletter.
